Holy Family Admissions September 2016

If your child will be 5 between 1st September 2016 and 31st August 2017, you will need to apply for a primary school place in November 2015

The governors will admit 30 children aged 4 in September 2016, children born on and between 1st September 2011 and 31st August 2012 may be admitted full time places.

Applications for a primary school place will open on 1st November 2015 and close on 15th January 2016. Places will be confirmed by email on 15th April 2016.


Applications are usually submitted online at www.leeds.gov.uk. **Holy Family also requires that you complete a Supplementary Information Form (SIF)** as well as your application to Leeds City Council. These forms are available at the school office, or from the school website. They should be returned to the school office.

School council have visited each class this week to talk about book swapping. We decided it would be a lovely idea to bring books to school that children no longer


want. Each class will have a special book box where they can donate or borrow a book.

Using the Library!

- Parents are welcome to come in on a Wednesday after School (starting after Christmas)
- We continue to do our best to promote the use of our school library. The children are encouraged to use it regularly. The best role models for encouraging reading are in the home: parents, grandparents, brothers and sisters. It is important that your children see you reading. Not just books, newspapers or magazines are good too.
- **Set the example...**We all know how much children copy their parents. Make sure they see you reading the newspaper, magazine, a book or a recipe. In copying you they will gain confidence and get to be great readers too.
- **Be nice...**praise your child for their efforts when reading—its fine for them to make mistakes. Its supposed to be fun!
- **Let them make some noise...** Encourage your children to read aloud—to you, friends, pets or even their toys. Hearing their own voice helps practise their speaking and builds confidence.
- **Its my brother who reads to me...** get older children to read to younger ones—not only some valuable time off for mums and dads, but younger children will follow their example in practising their reading later.
- **Its never too late to start...**even your youngest children love sharing a book. Point to the pictures and encourage them to babble away, they'll be talking before you know it!
- **Read it again Sam!** Although grown ups might like something new, children love to hear a good story again and again. Plus, repeating actually helps to build your child's language, so don't worry if they're hooked on one book.

On Saturday the 14th of November some children from KS2 attended a 'Super Saturday' event at Yeadon Tarn.



The children took part in Bell boating and canoeing. Leon in Year 6 said "It was really exciting and we got to
